House Bill 1236 would direct Maryland's Department of Transportation to enter into good faith negotiations with Virginia and other relevant parties to launch a pilot project to run MARC trains beyond Union Station to L'Enfant, Crystal City, and Alexandria in the coming years ahead of the completion of the Long Bridge, when up to eight MARC trains are expected to provide this service.

Currently, Maryland's MARC trains and Virginia's VRE trains both stop at Union Station but do not cross state lines; though some riders can use their VRE ticket on Amtrak as well.

Economic Development does not know or recognize county or state jurisdictional lines. As such, it is imperative for the future of our regional economy that workers are given multiple options to travel to-and-from various jurisdictions.

The prospect of MARC service from Maryland to Virginia can help change Maryland's thinking on what's possible with transportation planning. This potential will give Maryland a firmer competitive footing with Virginia while also forming broader partnerships.

For the aforementioned reasons, the Chamber supports House Bill 1236 and respectfully urges a favorable report.
