

The Maryland Association of School-Based Health Care (MASBHC) supports *Senate Bill 611 – Health – Mental and Emotional Disorders – Consent (Mental Health Access Initiative).* This bill would allow minors younger than 16 years old with the capacity to consent to mental health treatment.

There are currently 86 school-based health centers in Maryland providing a combination of primary care, behavioral, and oral health services to students. Recent data from the 2017-2018 school year showed that of the over 52,000 visits provided that year, nearly one-third were for behavioral health. This illustrates a great need for additional onsite mental health services for students, who may experience barriers to accessing services in the communityⁱ. Moreover, data from the CDC indicate that depression, anxiety and other behavior disorders occur in children much younger than 16 years oldⁱⁱ.



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For youth seeking health services, mental health is one of the only services where there remains an age requirement for obtaining parental consent.
