Dear Chair Kelley:

The Maryland Board of Nursing (“the Board”) is submitting this letter of support with amendments for SB0752 - Public Health - Non-Controlled Dangerous Substance Prescription Record System Program.

The Board strongly supports the Program’s mission in improving patient safety by allowing practitioners to access a patient’s drug history including drugs prescribed by other prescribers. We believe these efforts would help to coordinate patient care by promoting continuity and effective communication between healthcare practitioners as well as reduce unnecessary treatment and cost. We also believe the Program will further aid initiatives utilized by the State of Maryland including the Chesapeake Regional Information System (CRISP) and the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP).

We are proposing amendments to allow a nurse practitioner to be a part of the NCS Prescription Record System Program Advisory Committee.

For the reasons discussed above, the Board of Nursing submits this letter of support with amendments for SB0752.

Amendment 1. On page 8, after line 11 insert:

(VI) ONE NURSE PRACTITIONER, LICENSED AND PRACTICING IN THE STATE, NOMINATED BY THE NURSE PRACTITIONERS ASSOCIATION OF MARYLAND.
