The Maryland Board of Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers & Speech-Language Pathologists, in conjunction with the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors & Therapists, is submitting this Letter of Concern for HB 259 - Health Occupations - Diagnostic Evaluation and Treatment of Patients - Disciplinary Actions.

HB 259, as written, applies to all Health Occupations Boards and health care practitioners. Our Boards are concerned about the encroachment on its ability to enforce discipline in such cases. Further, we are concerned about how this could affect vulnerable patient populations and feel that it opens up the possibility of risky medical or counseling practice.

We urge the Committee to consider the applicability of this bill in relation to the Board of Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers & Speech-Language Pathologists, as well as the Maryland Board of Professional Counselors & Therapists, or other health care professions.
