We strongly support the addition of Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners (NP) to the list of providers who are eligible to examine individuals who are confined on observation status and provide testimony to a Hearing Officer

Psychiatric Nurse Practitioners are an essential part of the mental healthcare team in Maryland. Between 2006 and 2013, emergency visits increased by more than 50 percent for psychoses and bipolar disorders and depression, anxiety and stress reactions according to the Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project. As fewer physicians are entering into mental health practices, a serious threat to the health of Maryland citizens exists. Psychiatric NPs must be available and allowed to participate in assessing the mental health of these patients.
