Baltimore County **SUPPORTS** House Bill 530 – Health Occupations – Pharmacists – Administration of Vaccinations. This legislation would authorize a pharmacist to administer vaccinations to a minor between nine and eighteen years old. Additionally, the bill would require that a pharmacist can administer certain vaccinations in accordance with protocol that meets criteria established by the Department of Health, the Board of Physicians, and the Board of Nursing.

Because the majority of the population in America is vaccinated, diseases like polio, diphtheria, and pertussis have become rare. However, until they can be completely eliminated, it is necessary to continue to immunize people against them. Japan saw a major outbreak of pertussis in 1979 after the number of vaccinations for the disease dropped off. There is a concern that a similar phenomenon could emerge in the U.S. with measles.

One of the best ways to increase herd immunity and protect the population from preventable diseases, particularly children and the elderly, is to increase the availability of vaccines. HB 530 helps support these vital efforts.
