ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF LOCAL PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEMS IN THE STATE;

We respectfully request the addition of a nonpublic special education school representative. There is a wealth of expertise in the nonpublic special education school community and we have many member schools that specialize in the delivery of services specifically for children with autism. One of the reasons we are in support of this bill is because we believe having a centralized State strategic plan is helpful to identify gaps in the service delivery and to collaborate with local school systems, law enforcement agencies, state and local governments, community organizations, parents and other stakeholders to provide a comprehensive, coordinated approach of resources and services.
