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### **Testimony in Support of HB 1095 Prescription Drug Affordability Board and Fund**

The Unitarian Universalist Legislative Ministry of Maryland (UULM-MD), an advocacy organization with members in Unitarian Universalist (UU) congregations throughout the state, joins other advocates to support HB 1095. We have signed the Health Care for All Resolution showing the broad support for this legislation. Health care has been a priority since our establishment 15 years ago and is supported at our national level because it supports our unifying principles especially the respect for the inherent worth and dignity of each person.

Many individuals rely on affordable prescription medications for their basic health; yet, often these essential drugs are financially out of reach for many people. We support public policies to end outrageous and unfair costs for prescription medications. HB 1095 would create and fund a board to help determine how best to make prescriptions more affordable.

This issue has broad support -- a Kaiser Family Foundation 2017 survey found that 74% of Democrats and 71% of Republicans support allowing an independent group to oversee prescription drug pricing. Being able to acquire a medication to help treat a serious illness is essential for everyone whether the client is a parent with a sick child or an adult with a serious illness. One of the most agonizing situations is not being able to pay for a medication that could help, especially when the same drug can be purchased for much less in other countries that negotiate prices.

Marylanders are very fortunate to have legislators who are responsive and care about the needs of those who are often forgotten. Passage of HB 768 last year created the country's first Prescription Drug Affordability Board. This

groundbreaking legislation will serve as a watchdog and work to lower the cost of prescription in Maryland.

Additional legislation, HB 1095, is needed now to accelerate the Board's plans to institute an assessment on pharmaceutical manufacturers and supply chain members beginning in 2020. It will also prevent funding like the \$800,000, designated by you, to be held up by the Governor. Your funding was to fully support the Board.

We appreciate the opportunity to present our faith perspective and to work with you to make a difference in Maryland.

UULM-MD asks you to continue to lead the nation in making prescription drugs affordable for all. Please give HB 1095 a favorable report.
