I am writing to register my support for Senate Bill (HB) 72, authored by Senator Cory McCray. SB72 will officially authorize Baltimore City to create residency requirements for the command staff of the police department.

I knocked on thousands of doors in East Baltimore in the 13th District. Many of the residents talked about jobs and fighting for the working poor and middle class. Because there is not a residency requirement for police officers we are losing people to the surrounding suburbs. So many people have fled the city due to high taxes, crime and now years of decay. I want to discourage out-migration, and provide employment to city residents, and keep municipal salaries circulating in the local economy.

In order to make Baltimore a thriving city again, characterized by low unemployment, an increased tax base and a developing city starting to require residency requirements for those in supervisory positions is a step in the right direction.
