Subject: **SB268 – Victim’s Rights - Restitution**

The Legislative Committee of the Criminal Law & Practice Section of the Maryland State Bar Association (MSBA) **Supports SB268 – Victim’s Rights - Restitution**

This bill make a variety of useful changes to the law in regards to restitution for the victims of criminal acts. It requires a court to issue an Order of Restitution if warranted by the facts of a case. It allows for restitution for losses that are not the immediate and direct result of the criminal act. It clarifies who can be awarded restitution.

Importantly, it also requires that the defendant be notified about any restitution claim before it can be imposed. While ensuring that no defendant will be found in violation of probation or in contempt simply because they cannot afford to pay restitution, it also ensures that the court can still impose an Order of Restitution, which provides the victims assurance that they have a claim in the defendant later becomes able to pay.

For the reasons stated, we **Support SB268 – Victim’s Rights – Restitution.**
