SB0208 - Public Safety - Rifles and Shotguns - Secondary Transactions

My name is Nick DeTello, and I oppose this bill. Accessibility to firearms is a right. How would you feel about a bill that restricted any other right for the entire state of Maryland? For example, what if I had to pay a "reasonable fee" every time I spoke at a public hearing such as this (holding a dollar bill and placing it in a pile).
