Dear Chair Clippinger and Members of the House Judiciary Committee:

The Governor's Family Violence Council supports House Bill 248, a bill that changes the definition of "person eligible for relief" in a protective order to include anyone who alleges s/he is a victim of a rape or sexual offense, clarifying that they are eligible to receive a protective order rather than a peace order.

House Bill 248 clarifies that victims of a rape or sexual offense are eligible for a protective order and provides this group of victims with the special protections of a protective order that are not included in peace orders such as removal of firearms, a longer order and a stronger response by law enforcement.

House Bill 248 aligns with the mission of the Governor's Family Violence Council which is to provide recommendations that will reduce and eliminate abusive behaviors.

For these reasons, the Governor's Family Violence Council urges a favorable report on House Bill 248.
