Every year there is some new War-On-Drug policy, as if all the other incarcerations for 20, 25, or 40 years have curbed drug manufacturing, distribution, or possession. The news has been out for years now –The War on Drugs has failed –decade after decade after decade. For some reason, we fail to change our old outdated, ineffective policies, despite the plethora of evidence showing what does and doesn't work.

Adding on years of incarceration has not been shown to reduce overall drug use, and is simply a cruel and inhumane way to treat other human beings with problems.
