**RE: OPPOSITION TO
HOUSE BILL 910**

Chairman Clippinger & Members of the Committee,

Prohibited persons already cannot lawfully possess any firearm, whether home built or produced by a licensed manufacturer. All firearms are profoundly regulated under current federal law, regardless of how they are manufactured. The 1968 Gun Control Act, the 1988 Undetectable Firearms Act and other federal laws govern firearms produced by a 3D printing process or any other process, just as they apply to conventional manufacturing processes using high-end, highly skilled machinery.

Further, Maryland Code (MD Code, Public Safety, § 5-406) already provides that “a person may not manufacture for distribution or sell a handgun that is not included on the handgun roster in the State.” The code further states (MD Code, Public Safety, § 5-405) the criteria for which handguns must be judged in order to be placed on the handgun roster.

Therefore, adequate laws pertaining to firearms already exist. For these reasons we urge the committee to oppose House Bill 910.
