Juveniles Convicted as Adults - Sentencing

MCDAA POSITION: SUPPORT

Brief bill explanation: This bill authorizes a court, when sentencing a minor convicted as an adult, to impose a sentence less than the minimum term required under law. A court is prohibited from imposing a sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of parole or release. The bill also authorizes an individual who was convicted as an adult for an offense committed when the individual was a minor to file a motion with the court to reduce the duration of the sentence; the bill establishes related procedures.

MCDAA position: The Maryland Criminal Defense Attorney's Association supports legislation that addresses and fixes problems in the way juveniles are sentenced under Maryland law. This measure takes a laudable stand against sentencing minors as if they were adults. Those under 18 deserve additional protections and different considerations under the law; this philosophy was the driving force for the creation of the Juvenile Courts. Minors sentenced in "adult court" face sentences that could mean a life in prison for crimes committed before the defendant reached the age of majority. This law would force judges in "adult court" to be guided different considerations when sentencing minors.
