AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 3, after "Program" insert "<u>- Study</u>"; strike beginning with "establishing" in line 5 down through "Program;" in line 6; in line 8, strike "integrate" and substitute "<u>study the development of a certain Pilot Program that integrates</u>"; strike beginning with "requiring" in line 9 down through "County;" in line 12; in line 12, after "report" insert "<u>certain information</u>"; in lines 13 and 14, strike "defining a certain term;"; and strike in their entirety lines 16 through 21, inclusive.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, in line 23, strike "the Laws of Maryland read as follows"; and after line 23, insert:

- "(a) The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission shall coordinate with the Prince George's County public school system to study the development of a Summer Math, Reading, and Science Pilot Program that integrates math, reading, science, technology, and social sciences content into the Commission's summer parks and recreation programs offered in Prince George's County.
- (b) On or before December 1, 2020, the Commission shall report to the Prince George's County House Delegation, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the feasibility, cost, and potential barriers associated with implementing the Summer Math, Reading, and Science Pilot Program."



Bill: HB 1025 MNCPPC - Summer Math, Reading, and Science Pilot

What The Bill Does: This bill would mandate that the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission's ("Commission") Prince George's County Department of Parks and Recreation ("Department") develop and implement an education program in math, science, technology and social sciences. The program would be required on a pilot basis and subject to a three-year period before abrogation (sunset).

Discussion: Despite the bill's laudable objectives, the Commission's Prince George's County Planning Board respectfully opposes it because the initiative does not align closely with the core mission and capabilities of the agency or Department.

Even though the Department provides a significant number of summer programs that include traditional "enrichment" elements, the Department's leadership does not support accepting a new responsibility for measuring student performance/achievement with respect to science, technology and other preparatory education curricula. Particularly while the Department is in the throes of implementing last year's major initiative in youth sports programming, this legislation raises a bundle of very serious or conflicting operational concerns – for example, about the staffing commitment, professional qualifications, pressure on the recruitment process, education funding, bi-county participation, etcetera. The Department believes the costs associated with developing an appropriate workforce with expertise in the pertinent education disciplines, providing appropriate testing methods, and providing training and materials require resources better suited for a school system; not a parks and recreation agency. At the same time, the Board welcomes a renewed dialogue with stakeholders to explore opportunities for the Prince George's County Public School System to enhance coordination with the Department's summer recreation programs.

In short, the Board concludes that too many important details need to be resolved before making any commitment to launch a program of the scope contemplated by the bill.
