RE: House Bill 91 – Public Safety – Police Athletic League Grant Fund – Establishment – Support

Chairwoman McIntosh,

The Baltimore County Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge #4 and the Maryland State Fraternal Order of Police are in support of HB 91.

The Police Athletic League (PAL) is an important program for building relationships between youths and police officers in the community. The PAL program allows for nontraditional law enforcement and youth interaction that often leads to mentoring and the breaking down of barriers that have become quite visible in recent years.

In the beginning of the great recession in 2009 when funding priorities had to be made, many of these programs were deemed a “low priority” in tough budgetary times. Funding was cut and PAL facilities were either closed, had officers reassigned elsewhere or both. At the time, this seemed like a prudent decision. However, a decade later, we now deal with the unforeseen consequences of what was probably the most important purpose of this program. Building police, community, and youth relationships. We have since lost a whole generation of positivity. Hopefully with the passing of HB 91, there will be sufficient funding to allow this program to stay viable and open. Only then can we move forward in rebuilding the relationships we took for granted in the past.
