Madame Chair and Members of the Committee,

Thank you for allowing testimony today in support of SB0001. Voices Maryland is a grassroots organization focused on State and County level legislation and policies that impacts marginalized communities and veterans affairs. Educational legislation is of massive importance to these communities particularly due to how impacted these communities have been historically and currently.

Why we reinforce you support SB0001:

- → Grant state funding long overdue to historically black colleges and universities(HBCUs) in Maryland
- → Funding would begin FY2023, and it would be extended through 2032
- → establishing new programs and funding under appreciated programs
- → providing scholarships and financial aid
- → recruiting and trading faculty
- → creating additional academic support for students

- → Funding for marketing to attract new students
- → Address some inequities in current educational system

We at Voices Maryland support funding HBCUs because those who are educated in these fine institutions are better equipped to help to solve issues in marginalized and Veteran communities in Maryland.
