Testimony in Favor of SB0323
Maryland Arts and Culture Capital Grant Program

Chairman Guzzone, Vice-Chair Rosapepe, and members of the Budget and Taxation Committee,

I respectfully request a favorable report of Senate Bill 323. This bill would create the Maryland Arts and Culture Capital Grant (MACC) program to be administered by the Maryland State Arts Council. The MACC would be funded by a mandatory appropriation of \$3 million dollars and would distribute capital funding among our smaller arts organizations with operating budgets less than \$3 million dollars.

There is no question that arts organizations across Maryland play a vital cultural and economic role: annually, 9.2 million Marylanders enjoy arts events¹ and Maryland State Arts Council grantees generate a total economic impact of \$1.3 billion and create over 16,000 full-time equivalent jobs². However, many of these same organizations focus their limited funding on impactful programming and community engagement, leaving precious little money for desperately needed capital improvements.

This Committee is no stranger to the needs of the arts organizations that bring so much light to our communities. In my own District, our Shakespeare company is in desperate need of staff bathrooms, Maryland Hall is midway through transforming a high school into the premiere arts center of our County, and a half dozen smaller organizations are desperate to repair leaky roofs, stand up new classrooms, and become ADA compliant. These same stories play out across Maryland. This bill would give organizations across the State the opportunity, via a committed grant fund, to receive capital funding so they can continue to make their beneficial social, cultural, and economic impact in our communities.

These budget pressures on nonprofit organizations have only been exacerbated during the COVID-19 pandemic. As we hopefully begin to regain normalcy in the coming months, many of our arts



organizations will yet again have to make the difficult decision of fulfilling their capital needs or supporting their ever-important programming. SB 323 provides this vital support.

SUPPORT

Background: Senate Bill 323 (SB323) would establish the Maryland Arts Capital Grant Program with a mandated \$3 million-dollar yearly appropriation in the Governor's budget. It would be administered through the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC). Eligible recipients must have operating budgets of less than \$3 million dollars, have a 25% waivable match, and participate in MSAC's Grants for Organizations Program or Community Arts Development Program.

Written Comments: The Baltimore Jewish Council represents The Associated Jewish Community Federation of Baltimore and all of its agencies and programs, including the Gordon Center for Performing Arts. This Gordon is a 550-seat theater opened in 1995 and serves more than 30,000 people per year. If passed, the Maryland Arts Capital Grant Program could help the Gordon with much needed capital improvements. For this reason, the Baltimore Jewish Council urges a favorable report on SB323.
