#### A BILL ENTITLED

### Electric Generation - Transition From Fossil Fuels - Carbon Dioxide Emissions Rate and Transition Plan and Fund (Maryland Coal Community Transition Act of 2021)

FOR the purpose of prohibiting the carbon dioxide emissions rate for certain affected  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 electric generating units from exceeding a certain amount; establishing the Fossil  $\overline{7}$ Fuel Community Transition Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the 8 purposes of, authorized uses of, and allocation of funds from the Fund; requiring the 9 Maryland Department of Labor to establish certain policies and procedures for the 10 administration of the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; requiring 11 12an individual responsible for a certain project to hire certain subcontractors or sign 13a certain agreement; establishing the Fossil Fuel Transition Advisory Council; 14providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Council; providing for the 15term of a Council member; requiring the Council to meet a certain minimum number of times each year for certain purposes; prohibiting a member of the Council from 16receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 17expenses; requiring the Council to review the Department's proposals for grant 1819awards from the Fund and make certain recommendations; requiring the 20Department to consider certain recommendations of the Council when making 21certain decisions about awarding grants from the Fund; requiring the Council to 22develop a certain standard; requiring the Council to develop a certain statewide fossil 23fuel transition plan in a certain manner and to submit certain plans to the General 24Assembly on or before certain dates; requiring the Department to report, on or before 25a certain date each year, to the Governor, the Council, and the General Assembly; 26requiring an owner of an affected electric generating unit or, under certain circumstances, an electric generating unit permanently retired on or after a certain date to report, on or before a 27certain date each year, to the Council on certain information regarding employee 28layoffs; requiring the Maryland Energy Administration to use the Maryland 29Strategic Energy Investment Fund to provide a certain funding amount for certain 30 fiscal years for the Fund; providing for the application of certain provisions of this
