<u>House Bill 106 entitled Office of the Attorney General – Website to Report Robocalls and</u> <u>Other Spam Calls.</u>

Bill Overview:

Bill Outline:

- 2. Requiring that notice be provided to the public through print, radio, or television advertisements informing consumers how to: identify and report robocalls.
- 3. The Federal Trade Commission must be notified of each report it receives through the website regarding robocalls and spam calls.

Conclusion:

In conclusion, the purpose of this bill is to maintain a website to report robocalls and other spam calls, which allows consumers to identify and report the calls they receive. This will help protect individuals from financial fraud and other types of manipulation. The Federal Trade Commission and Office of Attorney General will work together in reporting robocalls to update the public.
