RE: House Bill 379 - Public Utilities - Low-Income Housing - Energy Performance Targets - Letter of Information

Dear Chairman Davis and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) respectfully submits this letter of information on House Bill (HB) 379 - Public Utilities - Low-Income Housing - Energy Performance Targets.

HB 379 would require the Department of Housing and Community Development to procure or provide low-income energy efficiency and conservation programs or services designed to achieve a target annual incremental gross energy savings of at least 1% per year starting in 2022. The legislation would also create the Green and Healthy Task Force, requiring the participation of several state agencies, including the Maryland Department of Health.

Due to ongoing COVID-19 response efforts, MDH unfortunately does not have the fiscal or personnel resources to implement this bill if it is passed. Many of MDH's current personnel have already increased their workload and absorbed additional tasks that are critical to the COVID-19 response.

We recognize and value the importance of this bill and its impact on Marylanders. As such, we respectfully request this bill be held and reintroduced in the 2022 Session. We look forward to working with the bill sponsor(s) and appropriate stakeholders in the interim.
