RE: HB 1171 Labor and Employment - Maryland Employee Protection Plan for Vaccine Refusal

Dear Chairman Davis:

The Maryland Building Industry Association, representing 1,100 member firms statewide, appreciates the opportunity to participate in the discussion surrounding HB 1171 Labor and Employment - Maryland Employee Protection Plan for Vaccine Refusal. MBIA Opposes the Act in its current version.

This bill would shield employees from being fired for refusing to be vaccinated when offered against COVID -19. MBIA respectfully opposes this measure. Even if employers are shielded from liability, COVID-19 is an extremely communicable disease that has the potential to affect multiple employees or clients when working in proximity. Vaccination is the single most important step in defeating this pandemic and moving the economy back on to normal ground. Employers need the right to protect their employees and clients from health consequences of their decisions. Vaccination decisions are not made in a vacuum and can represent significant risks for many businesses. Employers should retain the right to choose whether or not they assume those risks.

For these reasons, MBIA respectfully requests the Committee give this measure an unfavorable report. Thank you for your consideration.
