Mr. Chair, Ms. Vice Chair and members of the committee, my name is Michael Loll, and I represent the 700+ members of Indivisible Howard County. We are providing written testimony today in ***strong support of HB 784*** to incentivize the installation of electric vehicle (EV) charging equipment in new residential construction.

General Motors recently announced that it would be making EVs exclusively by 2035. Shell Oil has declared that its production has peaked. It is clear that an electric revolution is coming in transportation.
