House Bill 377 Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental Health Treatment

NCADD-Maryland strongly supports the passage of House Bill 377, a bill to establish the Commission on Student Behavioral Health and Mental Health Treatment.

We believe the evidence is clear that young people throughout the state are suffering, and there is a great need to enhance our collective ability to help them. Creating a Commission that examines the level of need, the gaps in services, the best practices, and the latest research will ensure we are using the most effective means to address the mental health and substance use problems young people are dealing with.

Of specific concern to NCADD-Maryland is the historical perspective that substance use in a school setting is dealt with as a disciplinary issue. Many times, a young person's use of substances is related to other issues of concerns, perhaps a mental health problem or a reaction to trauma. We support this Commission in recommending effective interventions that provide support to students, and not just a suspension. We also support the Commission looking at effective practices in working with community-based services that can engage with a young person and their family on an ongoing basis.

We urge a favorable report on HB 377.
