Testimony on: HB503 “Office on Climate Change – Establishment”

Position: Support

Hearing Date: February 3, 2021

Globally, nationwide, and in Maryland we are facing a growing, existential climate crisis. The signs are everywhere: unprecedented fires raging in California; record superstorms; analysis showing that the Colorado River has lost over a billion tons of water; huge decreases in winter snow in Maryland; flooding in Annapolis; and many, many more.

In Maryland, we have legislatively committed to significantly reducing our greenhouse gas emissions. The Greenhouse Gas Reduction Act declares that “[t]he State shall reduce statewide greenhouse gas emissions by 40% from 2006 levels by 2030.” Envir. Art. sec. 2-1204. Legislation introduced this session – the Climate Solutions Now Act (HB583) – would update this target to 60% by 2030, to reflect recent analyses by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, and require Maryland to achieve net-zero emissions by 2045.

This bill would help advance these efforts by establishing an Office on Climate Change in the Office of the Governor. We therefore urge a favorable report.
