Dear Delegate Barve and Committee Members:

This letter is submitted on behalf of the Maryland Legislative Action Committee ("MD-LAC") of the Community Associations Institute ("CAI"). CAI represents individuals and professionals who reside in or work with condominiums, homeowners associations and cooperatives throughout the State of Maryland.

MD-LAC supports HB 214. CAI supports protections that enable property owners to challenge and resolve efforts to take common property. CAI opposes legislative, regulatory or judicial actions that would limit or restrict the ability and rights of community associations to maintain control over association common property. HB 214 codifies common law regarding deed restrictions and riparian rights. Rather than reviewing deed restrictions related to riparian rights in the courts after construction, the bill would require the deed restrictions to be reviewed prior to a project being approved. The cost of protecting one's rights should not be such a burden as to disallow one from doing so.

Accordingly, the MD-LAC respectfully requests that the Committee give HB 214 a favorable report. We are available to answer any questions the Committee Members may have.
