BILL NUMBER: Senate Bill 352

SHORT TITLE: Agriculture – Multiflora Rose Management – Repeal

MDA POSITION: Support

EXPLANATION:

Senate Bill 352 is a departmental bill that repeals the Maryland Multiflora Rose Management Law. The state's agricultural industry has this plant contained and under control, therefore, the law is no longer needed.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Multiflora Rose Management Law was created in 1982 to address the increasing issue with the problematic pasture weed. At the time, Multiflora Rose was becoming a problem in areas of Maryland in abandoned pastures and uncared for non-agricultural lands. Since then, agricultural practices have changed and the need for the management law is no longer required.

The Maryland Department of Agriculture has not received a complaint related to the Multiflora Rose Management Law since before 1995.
