SUBJECT: HOUSE BILL 843, ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY- NATURAL RESOURCES-FISHING WITH A HAUL SEINE

On behalf of Naval Support Activity Annapolis, I am writing to express concern with House Bill 843, which would allow use of seine nets in areas that overlap waters used by the United States Naval Academy for training. While HB 843 does say that the net usage is prohibited in the Severn River, the bill defines the Severn River only as a line drawn from Greenbury Point to Horn Point. Under HB 843, seine nets would be allowed south of this line. This would cause issues for the United States Naval Academy, which uses this area for open water training. Seine nets can be very large (750 feet across), and once set, craft must stay away by up to 1,000 feet. This will greatly shrink the training area available to the United States Naval Academy. Deployed nets would also force longer transits for training vessels to find clear water.

Naval Support Activity Annapolis and the United States Naval Academy would welcome the opportunity to refine the bill to prevent harm to the United States Naval Academy's ability to accomplish its training mission.
