Disadvantaged Workers' Protection Preference

Upon review of House Bill 1212 - Procurement - Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Workers' Protection Preference, the Department of General Services (DGS) provides these comments for your consideration.

- House Bill 1212 provides a price percentage preference of 10% to a bidder who certifies that at least 50% of the workers on the contract are socially and economically disadvantaged. House Bill 1212 would significantly increase expenditures under contracts that award to vendors that meet the requirements of this bill and would necessarily increase the budget to allow agencies to afford to pay for these contractors.
- The extent to which House Bill 1212 would affect small businesses is unknown. However, if implemented, House Bill 1212 would **negatively impact small businesses** that were not also certified under the categories of disadvantaged groups/individuals as defined in statute in this legislation.
- There is no requirement under House Bill 1212 that the **State confirms that 50% or more of the contractor's workforce is socially and economically disadvantaged,** nor does it restrict a company from changing the composition of their workforce during the term of a contract.
