The Office of the Attorney General's Health Education and Advocacy Unit (HEAU) supports Senate Bill 741. We thank the sponsor for amending the bill to strengthen the coverage mandate for COVID-19 tests, including at-home tests, and for adding an express prohibition against cost sharing for tests and related items and services for the administration of tests. The bill no longer requires that private insurance be billed for testing provided by state and local governmental providers, thereby preserving access for all Maryland consumers to testing with no out-of-pocket costs or fear of post-testing billing. As a result of this bill, consumer confusion and financial distress over testing coverage and costs should be greatly reduced.

We also support the express requirement that the bill's testing, contact tracing and vaccination plan be designed to address the disproportionate impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on underserved and minority communities because supporting such remedial measures is a priority of the Office this session. *See* Attorney General's COVID-19 Access to Justice Task Force Final Report.
