Dear Delegate Dan Cox,

Please vote for HB 17, The Emergency Powers Limitations Consent of the Governed Act. It is urgent that you support this bill to prevent political agendas taking over our rights.

I am baffled by the sensationalism of the media regarding positive COVID "statistics". I do not believe positivity rates are an accurate reflection of the concern. Per coronavirus.maryland.gov on August 20th only 1,085,447 Marylanders had been tested. Compared with the positive results we technically had a 3.29% positivity rate. I believe this is a skewed way to look at the data. There are, pending 2020 census data results, about 6.1 million Marylanders. My urgency in this letter is shaped by my experiences as a mother, a seasoned psychotherapist, a former progressive democrat and now independent. As a mom very involved in parent communities I also hear how moms, dads and children from early grades to middle school and young adults are literally losing their minds, in very loving hard working families. The stress has compounded and it is well known the toll that stress takes on immune and overall physical health. And these are the lucky ones with internet, food and parental supervision. I shudder to think how many others are likely hanging on by their fingernails. And then there are those left untreated for other medical conditions. *And these injuries and deaths are not caused by covid 19. They've been caused by the shutdown*.

Specific to Covid 19 which has a 99.7%+ recovery rate for those under 70 and 95% recovery rate for those over 70, per the CDC's own numbers. - States and countries which have locked down and restricted commerce, education, and religious services do not have significantly lower hospitalization or mortality rates than states with limited or no restrictions
- Hospitalization has not exceeded capacity in the state of Maryland over the past year. Concern that critical Covid-19 cases would exceed hospital capacity was a fundamental premise for declaring and maintaining the state of emergency

There has been too much collateral damage to many Marylanders that was not necessary and in some ways the remedy for the virus has turned out to be worse than the virus itself.

I am also deeply concerned that the procedures used for implementation of emergency orders for the current crisis have the potential to open a proverbial "Pandora's Box" for future decisions to be made in the next crisis, real or perceived. which will be sure to come. I believe that the measures outlined in HB17 will go a long way in alleviating some of those concerns.
