## SB 586 Vehicle Emissions Inspection Program – Exemptions – Older Drivers

Chairman Smith, Vice Chair Waldstreicher and Members of the Judicial Proceedings Committee:

Thank you for this opportunity to present <u>SB 586</u>, Vehicle Emissions Inspection Program – Exemptions – Older Drivers to you. This bill was requested by a constituent.

SB 586 is a very simple piece of legislation that lowers the minimum age to 65 for an owner of a motor vehicle to be exempt from mandatory emissions testing requirements and increases from 5,000 to 10,000 the maximum number of miles that the vehicle may be driven annually in order to be exempt from mandatory inspection and testing requirements.

Thank you for your consideration of SB 586 and I urge the committee to move this bill with a favorable report.

## Testimony on <u>SB 586</u>
