A study conducted at the University of Oxford notes, "Grandparents play a high-level role in the emotional and behavioral development of children." Boston College has found that "an emotionally close relationship between grandparent and grandchild is associated with fewer symptoms of depression for both generations."

Grandparents tend to have the patience and wisdom necessary to provide a stable foundation in the lives of their grandchildren amidst disruptions in the family structure. They are at times a listening ear, a mediator between parents and children, sound advice, and in some cases, provide financial assistance to support their grandchildren. Despite all of this, there are grandparents that are denied visitation and quality time with their grandchildren everyday, even in cases when the grandchildren desire to spend time with them as well. When grandparents are kept away from their grandchildren, it is the grandchildren who ultimately lose out on these important advantages.

However, this disruption in the family nuclei not only affects the grandchildren, but it also negatively impacts grandparents. Most grandparents have reported feeling happier spending time with their grandchildren. This is beneficial for their psychological health, as the more close of a bond between grandparent and grandchild, the stronger the anti-depressive perk.
