FAVORABLE FOR HB0304 STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION IN FEDERAL IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT

Chairman Clippinger, Vice Chair Atterbeary, and Committee members,

We Support HB0304.

Here in the City of Frederick we are building a welcoming, inclusive, and just community. Over just the last few years we have taken great measures to reform our city hiring policies, procurement and contracting procedures, and community engagement processes; all with a goal of increasing equity and inclusion in our diverse city.

For our progress to continue, we support the passage of HB0304 in the General Assembly. Our city boasts an increasingly large immigrant and ethnic minority population that contributes wonderfully to our community's vibrancy, prosperity, and spirit. These residents deserve to trust their local government and know that it is here for them, to meet their needs, and help create a better future their families. Sadly, we do not have that trust.

Local participation with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agreements, such as 287(g), directly and significantly contribute to increased fear of law enforcement and a general lack of trust for local government. While the Frederick Police Department does not participate in such programs, the Frederick County Sheriff's Department's cooperation with ICE is well known throughout the community and has produced a severe chilling effect on cooperation with all local law enforcement. By extension, these

cooperative agreements with ICE have created a reluctance to engage with government more generally, even as our municipal government strives toward inclusion.

As Aldermen of the City of Frederick, we support a favorable report on HB0304.
