RE: HB851 - Corrections - Restrictive Housing - Serious Mental Illness

**Position: SUPPORT** 

Dear Chair Clippinger and Members of the Committee,

The Maryland Psychological Association (MPA), which represents over 1,000 doctoral-level psychologists from throughout the state, is writing in support of HB00851: Corrections -Restrictive Housing - Serious Mental Illness which would place certain limits and require certain safeguards as it relates to certain types of restrictive housing in correctional settings for inmates with a serious mental illness and functional impairments.

It has been recognized that significant segregation from others for extended periods of time can have a deleterious impact upon inmates emotional and behavioral states, especially those who are already vulnerable due to serious mental health concerns. A large portion of inmates in correctional settings experience significant mental health concerns, and that many of those inmates have serious/chronic forms of mental illness. This bill takes important steps to ensure that restrictive housing is used only when necessary for these individuals, and in a manner that prioritizes harm reduction. We welcome the opportunity to discuss this bill in greater detail and offer our support.

For these reasons, the Maryland Psychological Association asks for a FAVORABLE report on HB851.
