any police.

To improve our lives and community, we need the Maryland Trust Act because it is important for people

to live without fear. All people, including immigrants, should be able to drive on the road and know that

the police will respect our dignity. We shouldn't be judged at first sight.

Please consider my testimony and the importance of the Maryland Trust Act for all immigrant families in

the DMV. Thank you for the opportunity to share my experience with you and for representing all

immigrants and hearing our voices.
