The Maryland Judiciary opposes House Bill 585. This bill prohibits a collection agency from passing to a consumer any costs associated with certain filing fees. It also establishes the Financial Capabilities and Legal Assistance Fund as a special, non-lapsing fund to receive and distribute funds to qualified nonprofit entities that provide counselling services and legal assistance to consumers related to consumer credit and debt collections.

First, ordinarily the clerks, not the State Court Administrator or the Chief Judge of the District Court, collect filing fees.

In addition, this legislation would be difficult to implement by the Judiciary. It would be impossible for clerks to identify qualifying cases in order to assess the \$30 fee where appropriate, and separately account for the revenue generated. The Judiciary would need to implement controls to ensure the filing fee is not included in any judgment amounts, as a collection agency cannot pass the fee onto the consumer.
