RE: **SUPPORT** – House Bill 200 – *Public Safety – Access to Firearms – Storage Requirements (Jaelynn’s Law)*

The Maryland Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (MDAAP) is a statewide association representing more than 1,100 pediatricians and allied pediatric and adolescent healthcare practitioners in the State and is a strong and established advocate promoting the health and safety of all the children we serve. On behalf of MDAAP, we submit this letter of **support** for House Bill 200.

House Bill 200 strengthens Maryland’s current requirements for a minor’s access to firearms and firearm storage. The bill increases the age of a “child” from 16 to 18 for purposes of application of the storage requirements and specifies the requirements for minors to have access to firearms and for their storage. The legislation also strengthens current penalties for failure to store a firearm as specified to include the potential imprisonment not to exceed three years if a minor is harmed by as a result of the failure to properly store the firearm.

It has been well documented that the presence of unlocked guns in the home increases the risk of both accidental and intentional gun injuries. In fact, the vast majority of the guns used in youth suicide attempts and unintentional injuries were guns that were in the residence of the victim, a relative, or a friend. Strengthening Maryland’s firearm storage requirements will keep dangerous firearms out of the hands of children and will reduce community and school shootings, unintentional shootings, and youth suicide. Passage of the storage requirements included in House Bill 200 are long overdue. MDAAP urges a favorable report.
