The Maryland State Bar Association (MSBA) opposes **House Bill 1106** - **Catastrophic Health Emergencies - Immunity from Civil Liability.** House Bill 1106 would provide that any owner, a lessee, or a tenant of a premises is not civilly liable for any act or omission resulting in injury or death relating to exposure or alleged exposure to Covid-19 on the premises if the owner, lessee, or tenant, or an agent of the owner, lessee, or tenant, acted in good faith to follow and enforce on the premises all federal, state, and local health guidelines applicable at the time of the exposure or alleged exposure. Moreover, the bill would provide for retroactive application of the Act.

While the MSBA believe that this measure is well-intended, we believe that the immunity provisions contained in the bill are overly broad and would serve to preemptively deny injured individuals potential redress though the legal system. Further, we find that the retroactive application of this measure would strip injured individuals of rights that they currently possess is seeking justice.
