Re: HB 450 – Election Law – Polling Sites – Firearms Prohibitions

The Office of Attorney General urges this Committee to report favorably Delegate Henson's HB 450. This legislation makes pellucidly clear that no one can carry or display a firearm at, or within 100 feet of, a polling place during an election. If enacted, those who violate the statue would be subject to a civil penalty of up to \$5,000.

The 2020 election and its aftermath illustrated that passions run high across the country. Permitting individuals to display or carry firearms in the context of high passions and a deeply divided electorate is a recipe for disaster. Moreover, the presence of armed individuals at polls causes voter intimidation and coercion.¹ House Bill 450 is an appropriate means to deter such voter intimidation.

For the foregoing reasons, we urge a favorable report on HB 450.
