Prince George’s County Young Democrats Support Nine Pre-Filed Bills

Prince George’s County, MD - The membership of the Prince George’s County Young Democrats Legislative Committee have unanimously supported the following pieces of legislation:

- **MC/PG 103–21:** *Public Ethics – Bicounty Commissions – Retention of Financial Disclosure Forms;*
- **PG 502–21:** *Prince George’s County – Board of Education and Chief Executive Officer – Revisions;*
- **PG 406–21:** *Prince George’s County – Land Use – Magnetic Levitation Transportation System Siting (Prince George’s County Stop the Maglev Act of 2021);*
- **MC/PG 106–21:** *Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission – Prince George’s County – Concrete Batching Plants – Setback Requirement;*
- **PG 410–21:** *Prince George’s County – Coal– and Gas–Fired Generating Stations – Prohibitions (Prince George’s County Stop Environmentally Unjust Coal and Gas Plants Act of 2021);*
- **PG 407–21:** *Maryland Emergency Management Agency, Department of Transportation, and Department of the Environment – Study on Historic and Recent Flooding in Prince George’s County;*
- **MC/PG 107–21:** *Bicounty Agencies – Prince George’s County – Use and Occupancy Permits – Notice Requirements.*
- **MC/PG 100–21:** *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Video Streaming and Archiving Meetings and Late Payment Charges;*
- **MC/PG 102–21:** *Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Board of Ethics – Financial Disclosure Statements – Late Fees.*

Support with amendments, all amendments introduced by Richard DeShay Elliott:

- **PG 402–21:** *Natural Resources – Sunday Deer Hunting – Prince George’s County. “Hours of hunting will be established between sunrise and sunset”*
- **MC/PG 101–21:** *Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission – Mandatory Referral Review. “Aforementioned referral will denote the list of active development projects and donations to elected officials in Prince George’s County.”*
- *“Elected Members of the Prince George’s County Board of Education will determine the health curriculum and implementation.”*
- **PG 504–21:** *Prince George’s County – Elementary School Students – Daily Physical Activity (Student Health and Fitness Act). “Elected Members of the Prince George’s County Board of Education will determine the health curriculum and implementation.”*
- **PG 302–21:** *Prince George’s County – Speed Monitoring Systems – Residential Districts and School Zones. “All fines and fees established under this legislation will be levied in a progressive manner, and revenues will have a dedicated focus on infrastructure improvements and road slowdown technologies.”*
- **PG 501–21:** *Prince George’s County Board of Education – Nonstudent Member Compensation and Student Member Scholarship. “Bill must not reduce the scholarship amount for Student Member of the Board and will end salaries for appointed Board Members.”*
