WRITTEN TESTIMONY

House Bill 916 – Education – Middle and High Schools – Financial Literacy Curriculum and Graduation Requirement

Ways and Means Committee
February 17, 2021

SUPPORT

Background: House Bill 916 (HB916) would update the Maryland State Curriculum to include course material on financial literacy. This includes applying for and managing student loans and filing taxes. Public school students would be required to complete one financial literacy course in middle and high school, which will be a prerequisite for graduation. Additional this bill establishes Financial Literacy Education Week.

Written Comments: As we find ourselves in yet another financial crisis there has never been a more critical time to ensure we are educating every Maryland student about financial literacy. HB 916 would ensure that before students make some of the most consequential decisions of their lives, they have more tools and resources available to them.

The student debt crisis in America is growing. According to the US Federal Reserve, 54% of college students in 2020 took on student loans. The total amount of student debt in the United States has continued to swell, from \$1.06 trillion in 2014, to \$1.57 trillion in 2020. Currently 6.5% of all student debt is in default or over 90 days late. This situation is not sustainable.

Taxes are complicated. The average score of a basic 2015 tax aptitude survey of US adults was just 50%. This speaks to just how complex the US tax system is and how uneducated Americans are about paying taxes.

There is no minimum age requirement for taking on student loans or paying taxes. Yet the impacts of decisions made around student loans or taxes can reverberate for the rest of one's life. Students are required to take courses in mathematics, science, and social studies, yet are allowed to graduate without the practical financial education they will need for almost every day of their lives. With this in mind, the Baltimore Jewish Council urges a favorable report of HB 916.
