MCF strongly supports HB 824

We know that children can experience significant behavioral health issues as the result of cyber usage. Studies have shown that cyber-bullying is a significant problem that can result in anxiety, depression, and suicidal ideation. Also, they have shown that the overuse of social media can contribute to depression in youth. Moreover, there are web sites and posts that promote and provide how-to information about self-harm, suicide, eating disorders, and more.

Children and youth need to receive information about the potential dangers of cyber usage and how to engage in responsible use. Families and educators too need to know about the potential threats, and receive training on how to promote cyber safety.

Schools are the logical place to provide students with training on cyber safety, and for conveying such information to families and educators.

Legislation such as HB 824 is long overdue. Therefore we urge a favorable report.
