## Senate Bill 913 – Board of Public Works – Historic Sotterley – Operating Grant

Dear Chair McIntosh and Members of the Committee:

I am writing to introduce Senate Bill 913 – Board of Public Works – Historic Sotterley – Operating Grant. This bill would provide operating grants to Historic Sotterley, which is located in St. Mary's County, in each of the next three fiscal years.

As many of you know, I often talk about the rich history located in District 29. As a UNESCO Site of Memory and a National Historic Landmark, Sotterley is a very important part of that history. Speaking from personal experience having attended a number of programs held at Sotterley, I know that they are dedicated to preserving our history and telling the full story of St. Mary's County and of Maryland, and, in turn, of our country. As one example of how they fulfill their mission and work to tell this story is through working with the Maryland State Department of Education to provide educational programs for our State's students.

The General Assembly has recognized and supported Historic Sotterley's important work with capital grants in 2016 and 2020. However, this additional support is necessary because Sotterley does not have an endowment and operates only on earned income. These funds would help Historic Sotterley maintain and grow their educational mission.

This bill sunsets on June 30, 2026. I respectfully request a favorable report on Senate Bill 913. Thank you for your consideration.
