parents because I can't afford my rent, monthly bills, and childcare. Children should not have to always

see their parents worried, stressed and tired.

It is a horrible feeling to spend 8+ hours a day, 5 days a week at a job that cannot pay your bills, cannot put food on the table, and cannot put clothes on the back of people that depend on you most. This is why we are asking for your support. Vote YES on HB 90 so the hard working OPD employees can have a voice on the job, and advocate for a better agency.
