Dear Chair McIntosh,

The Maryland Department of Disabilities (MDOD) is pleased to provide this letter in support of Senate Bill 169, departmental legislation requested by the Governor's Office of Community Initiatives (GOCI).

The purpose of SB169 is to provide additional clarity on the State Coordinator for Autism Strategy position and the Advisory Stakeholder Group on Autism Related Needs.

SB 169 transfers and amends Article – Human Services 13 Section 7–111 and 7–112 to Article – State Government 18 Section 9.5–102 and 9.5–103, aligning the budget appropriation with GOCI, the corresponding state government entity. It also enacts technical amendments improving the administration of the Advisory Stakeholder Group on Autism-Related Needs and subsequent reporting as follows:

- Adding General Assembly membership to the Advisory Stakeholder Group on Autism-Related Needs;
- Changing the annual reporting due date from July to December to ensure the report aligns with related and companion state reporting.
 - A similar change in MDOD's 2017 departmental allowed the department to improve the accuracy and completeness of data provided by state and federal agencies; and
- Amending the Advisory Stakeholder Group administration details (staffing, chair, reporting submission, and publication requirements to more closely align with similar state government advisory groups).

MDOD respectfully requests a favorable report.
