Testimony on: SB 783 - Constitutional Amendment - Environmental Rights

Dear Members of the Judicial Proceedings Committee,

As you consider the merits of **SB 783**, I ask that you support this vital legislation and vote to give **SB 783** a **Favorable** Committee report.

The City of Salisbury supports a Constitutional Amendment for Environmental Rights. This amendment would prioritize statewide climate action by protecting Marylanders' individual and collective rights to a healthful environment. This bill is essential as it establishes a right to a healthful environment while helping to preserve our pristine environment and natural resources for the benefit of future generations.

This Constitutional Amendment for Environmental Rights would enable communities, individuals, and governments to safeguard public health and safety while also helping to fill in the gaps to provide additional protections where current statutes and regulations may fall short. All Marylanders would benefit from the recognition of a fundamental and inalienable right to a healthful and sustainable environment; we must recognize this right by enshrining it as an amendment to the Maryland State Constitution.

SB 783 will allow Maryland to stand as a leader at the vanguard of climate action as we recognize our presumed natural right to a healthful environment as a constitutional right, protected under the law for the benefit of both our individual and collective wellbeing.
