Chair Guzzone and Members of the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee;

Thank you for hearing SB 664 Income Tax – Film Production Activity Tax Credit – Filming Locations. This bill would direct a portion of the existing Film tax credit program for film production activities in Allegany, Caroline, Dorchester, Garrett, Kent, Prince George's, Somerset, Washington, and Wicomico Counties.
