- As someone who has played various roles within the health care system since 1991 volunteer, technician, staff nurse, nurse case manager, nursing instructor, graduate student, and professor of nursing- I have witnessed how resources are wasted and efforts are futile because so many members of the health care system either ignore the needs of the community or fail to understand them. Only through earning the trust and empathizing with the members of this community we can achieve overall community well-being.
- Allowing undocumented members of the community to obtain practice licenses and certifications
 will ascertain that every provider is practicing within the constraints of their discipline regulating
 body.
- Last, as a society, we need to stop criminalizing those members of the community who work hard, pay taxes but are not entitled to returns, and are denied the many perks and advantages that other members of their community enjoy.

No one chooses the family or location that they are born into. All we can do is choose to live an honest and decent life. Please do not deny undocumented members of our communities their right to practice in the disciplines that they have diligently prepared to perform.
